2hrs 5mins Dir: Ciro Guerra UK 2016

Though inspired by real-life journals, Guerra's haunting and beautifully shot monochrome film transports us into the realm of the mystical and surreal. A fascinating story of the relationship between Karamakate, an Amazonian shaman and last survivor of his people, and two scientists who work together over the course of 40 years to search the Amazon for a sacred healing plant. A complicated mixture of myth and historical reality, this film shatters lingering illusions of First World culture as more advanced than any other, except technologically.

1hr 37mins Dir: Dan Kwan & Daniel Scheinert USA 2016

On a deserted island, Hank Thompson (Paul Dano) is getting ready to hang himself. He then sees the body of a young man (Daniel Radcliffe) wash up on the shore. Hank befriends the corpse, naming it Manny, only to discover that his new friend can talk and has a myriad of supernatural abilities, which may help him get home. Hank miraculously makes it back to the mainland but then finds himself lost in the wilderness, dragging the talking corpse along for the adventure. An extraordinary film, fuelled by great performances.

Linguistics Professor Louise Banks (Amy Adams) leads an elite team of investigators when gigantic spaceships touchdown in 12 locations around the world. As nations teeter on the verge of global war, Banks and her crew must race against time to find a way to communicate with the extraterrestrial visitors. Hoping to unravel the mystery, she takes a chance that could threaten her life and quite possibly all of mankind. An ambitious, epic yet intimate sci-fi film that forces viewers to reconsider that which makes us truly human.

From the director of the Oscar-winning documentary '20 Feet from Stardom', 'The Music of Strangers' tells the extraordinary story of the renowned international musical collective the Silk Road Ensemble created by legendary cellist Yo-Yo Ma. The feature-length documentary follows this group of diverse instrumentalists, vocalists, composers, arrangers, visual artists and storytellers as they explore the power of music to preserve tradition, shape cultural evolution and inspire hope. Lee Chandler (Ben Affleck) is a brooding, irritable loner who works as a handyman for a Boston apartment block. One damp, winter day he gets a call summoning him to his hometown, north of the city. His brother's heart has given out suddenly, and he's been named guardian to his 16-year-old nephew Patrick (Lucas Hedges). As if losing his only sibling and doubts about raising a teenager weren't enough, his return to the past re-opens an unspeakable tragedy. Masterfully told and beautifully acted - a shattering yet graceful elegy of loss and grief.
